I am so grateful for a church community that does life together, but also looks outward to the community and world beyond the doors of the church.



What a joy it is has been these last two months offering hospitality to families seeking asylum! In March and April, volunteers gave around 1,500 volunteer hours to greet families and stay overnight in the church building. More than 42 volunteers came from four churches and Macalester College. I know that every person we welcomed felt at home in the church building and well cared by our community. Guest families even joined in the community Easter Egg Hunt and Maundy Thursday worship. Thank you to the many who made this ministry a success! Besides being an impactful and joyful experience, Faithful Hospitality generated \$10,000 in rental income for the church General Fund.

Minnesota UMC Annual Conference Session

The 170th session of the Minnesota Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church will be held May 28-30, 2024 from 9:00am to 5:00pm each day in Bloomington, MN. Drawing from Isaiah 43:1, the theme of this year's Annual Conference is "Jesus. Redeemer."

This year at Annual Conference, former Eli Intern from 2019 will be commissioned as a provisional elder and will be appointed to her first church in Hutchinson, MN after graduating from seminary this spring. Pastor Shawna will serve as

her sponsor and has been her candidacy mentor throughout these past several years.

We will also be supporting the annual "Love Offering" which will support Emma Norton's new housing project Restoring Waters, trauma care in Ukraine, legal aid for asylum seekers and immigrants, and scholarships to serve with Volunteers in Mission. General Conference (the global United Methodist Church session) will meet April 23-May 3 in Charlotte, North Carolina. At General Conference, we expect that there will be discussion around a plan for "regionalization" which will allow different geographical areas to have modified Book of Disciplines that will better fit their values and theological stances, with special attention to matters relating to human sexuality. While we know that the process of changing our Book of Discipline to be more inclusive will take time and could encounter some bumps along the way, in Minnesota we are committed to a fully inclusive church.

Covenant Discipleship Groups

Covenant Discipleship Groups are small groups that meet regularly, often weekly or monthly, to support one another in their personal commitments of faith practice. They are not Bible studies per say, rather peer groups that creates a covenant for each person to practice their faith beyond just Sunday mornings, through personal Bible study, prayer, acts of service and compassion, worship, and other faith formation opportunities. These groups can meet in person or online.



In Person Worship Tips:

<u>Communion</u> is offered every first Sunday during worship. During Lent this year, most Sundays will feature Holy Communion.

First Fruits food donations are generally collected the first Sunday of every month.



Adult Faith Formation

We'll use the curriculum Transformed Community: Freed and Empowered for Radical Welcome created by the Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services. Each week we'll look at key Bible verses and what they mean for us, while hearing more about the experience of migrants and refugees and how we are called to community with them.

First Fruits

A brief overview for those new to Fairmount or may have questions: Keystone Community Services is an organization dedicated to alleviating food insecurity and has been serving Ramsey County for over 80 years. With the opening of their new facility at 1800 University Avenue in St. Paul, Keystone's food shelf, mobile food delivery, and community resource assistance are housed in this one hub.

Each month, usually the first Sunday, we collect food, monetary donations and other items for Keystone. These "First Fruits" are collected by our children during worship. They are delivered to Keystone by our volunteers during the following week. While nonperishable food items are always appreciated, the most requested items at food shelves and food mobiles are paper products. The following are high-need items and ones which Keystone cannot spend food dollars supplying: diapers, toilet paper, paper towels, toothbrushes/paste, and feminine hygiene items. In addition, we recently learned that Keystone collects and reuses paper grocery bags and empty egg cartons. Keystone's website has more

Updated News about Cindy

In 2021, Fairmount Avenue UMC helped Macalester Plymouth United Church support a teenager named Cindy. Cindy is a U.S. citizen who was living on her own after her parents were deported. We used Endowment Funds and donations from generous FAUMC members to help support her while she lived with a Macalester Plymouth church member. We recently received this update from Janeen at Macalester Plymouth. Cindy has been thriving. She graduated from high school and moved into a dorm at the University of Minnesota. Later, she moved to an apartment large enough for her sisters in California to join her. One sister turned 18, graduated from high school in June 2023, moved here in July, and started at St. Paul College studying graphic arts. Cindy's youngest sister arrived in mid-September 2023 and started her second year of high school at St. Paul Central. Cindy continues doing well at the University of Minnesota, majoring in Global Studies. She's been accepted for a 6-week summer study program in South Korea. To keep her sisters in the apartment while she's gone, they have been working extra hours at Target. Their parents have applied for asylum to rejoin their daughters here. They are working in a Samsung TV factory in Tijuana. Her dad is a foreman earning only \$13 per day, and her mom does quality control.

May is Mental Health Awareness month. There are many types of mental illness. I would like to share some information with you from the Mayo Clinic regarding depression. There are many types of depression. This information is about Major Depressive Disorder.

Depression is a mood disorder that causes feelings of sadness that just don't go away. It isn't a weakness or character flaw. People just can't snap out of it without help. It can affect people of all ages, races, income levels, and educational background. Approximately 1 in 6 people will experience a major depressive episode during their lifetime. For some it's a one-time event, but for most it does recur. Treatment does help.

There is **no single cause**. Experts believe it's a combination of biological, social, and psychological factors. People with a higher risk include those with a family history of a depressive disorder, those with a chronic condition such as pain, cancer, or heart disease, hormonal changes such as pregnancy and menopause, disruption of neurotransmitters like serotonin

that regulate many body functions, traumatic life events, lack of food or housing, lack of support, and substance abuse.

The list of **possible symptoms** is long. These include feelings of sadness or hopelessness, angry outbursts or irritability, to much or too little sleep, reduced or increased appetite, restlessness, slowed thinking, movement, or speech, trouble concentrating, fixating on past failures, physical problems and pains, and can include frequent thoughts of death or suicide. Children may be clingy or refuse to attend school. Additionally older adults may have memory difficulties, or often want to stay home. For many people symptoms are severe enough to interfere with their day to day activities. Some people may feel sad or miserable without knowing why.

If you feel depressed, make an appointment with your physician or a mental health professional. Diagnosis usually includes a physical exam to determine if an underlying health issue may be the cause. Blood tests will also be done. You may be evaluated by a psychiatrist who will ask about symptoms, thoughts, feelings, and behavior patterns to see if the person meet the criteria for a diagnosis of depression. If you are reluctant to do this, talk to a trusted friend, love one, or faith leader. Treatment helps most people with depression. It may consist of medication and/or working with a therapist. If one medication doesn't help, keep working with your physician to find one that does. It will take time and patience; some take a while to be effective. Do not stop taking without talking to your Dr.

If you think you might hurt

yourself, call 911 or the Suicide & Crisis Line at 988. If someone you know is in danger of suicide or has attempted it, make sure someone stays with them and also call the emergency number.

Although there is no sure way to prevent depression, these strategies may help.

Take steps to prevent stress to increase your resilience and boost your self-esteem. Walk, journal, pray, learn to say "no." Reach out to family and friends, especially in times of crisis. It may help to talk with a trusted friend. Get treatment at the earliest sign of a problem to help prevent the depression from worsening. Consider getting long-term maintenance treatment to help prevent a relapse.

Remember no matter how bad it feels, you are not alone. Your friends and family care about you. You can always trust that God cares about you and loves you.
